IRVING

Yes, the rumors are true. Irving and Circle K have been approved by the planning board for a gas station; convenience store on the former Soda Shoppe property on Central Street. More details coming soon.

NEWFOUND PET CENTER

The owners of Newfound Pet Center in Bristol have opened a 2nd location in Franklin, 760 Central Street (near The Blossom Shop). I've heard nothing but rave reviews about the pet products in the store – check them out.

KETTLEHEAD

In the meantime, Kettlehead Distribution Center and Tasting room/restaurant is OPEN for business. You can locate them in the mill immediately adjacent to Canal Street. Check them out – the mezzanine overlooking the brewery is stunning.

The developer in this project let us know that the project start date is pushed out as it is taking a little longer than expected to complete their due diligence with the State Environmental office for the project design. We've asked Cumberland Farms to put out a sign that says "coming soon" and includes bits of information

about the project. It is on order. We've also asked them to clean up the site a little. Please be patient, this project is complex on many levels but will be worth the wait.

STEVENS MILL

Chinburg Builders, the developer for the largest mill on Canal Street along the river, is moving right along with the renovations. The project will offer 153 market rate living units as well as mixed-use commercial/light industrial. Cranes have been hoisting materials up to the highest floors and workers are busy.

Expected completion date for the units is December 31, 2023

PEABODY PLACE
