OBJECTIVES

- Greater understanding of the substance use rates in the Franklin community using the 2009-2013 YRBS data.
- Better understanding of the data on substance use perceptions and behaviors as shown by the 2013 and 2014 data comparison.

WHAT THE YRBS IS AND IS NOT

- It is valid and reliable. It has been tested multiple times. Findings are consistent with other survey findings.
- It is a **tool** and can be used for **positive changes**, rather than adding negativity to the community's reputation.
- Data reflects the community perceptions and behaviors; the school is simply a place where it is administered.
- It is not a "report card" of the school.
- It does **not encourage use** of substances or other unhealthy behaviors.




PAST 30-DAY ALCOHOL USE

Percentage of High School Aged Youth who Reported Past 30-Day Use of Alcohol




PAST 30-DAY BINGE DRINKING






PAST 30-DAY MARIJUANA USE

Percentage of High School Aged Youth who Reported Past 30-Day Use of Marijuana




PAST 30-DAY PRESCRIPTION DRUG MISUSE



- It focused on a limited number of YRBS questions from the NH Department Of Education YRBS survey.







Percentage of High School Aged Youth that Reported Great Risk of Harming Themselves




PERCEPTION OF RISK OF HARM BY SUBSTANCE USE




PEER DISAPPROVAL 2013-2014

Percentage of High School Aged Youth that Reported Their Friends Feel it is Wrong or Very Wrong to:




PEER DISAPPROVAL BY SUBSTANCE USE




PARENT DISAPPROVAL 2013-2014

Percentage of High School Aged Youth that Reported Their Parents Feel it is Wrong or Very Wrong to:




PARENT DISAPPROVAL BY SUBSTANCE USE




EASE OF ACCESS 2013-2014

Percentage of High School Aged Youth that Reported it was Very Easy to Get the Following:










SADNESS OR HOPELESSNESS BY SUBSTANCE USE

Reported Suicide Attempt and Substance Use




FAMILY & COMMUNITY INDICATORS 2013-2014

Percentage of High School Aged Youth that Reported Agreement with the Following:




CLEAR RULES & CONSEQUENCES BY SUBSTANCE USE

Agreement that Family has Clear Rules & Consequences and Substance Use




PARENT CONVERSATION BY SUBSTANCE USE

Talked with at Least One Parent about the Dangers of Substance Use and Substance Use




MATTERING TO THE COMMUNITY BY SUBSTANCE USE
