ATTENDING

I. MOUNTAIN BIKE SCHOOL

Chief Goldstein advised the committee that the department will be holding a mountain bike school this June to certify other local officers. Currently Franklin Police Department and Concord Police Department are the only two departments in the state to offer this course. Chief Goldstein stated that in the Fall of 2021 the department had sent Detective Sergeant Matthews and Officer Francis to Utah to become certified mountain bike instructors.

II. SRO STATUS

Chief Goldstein stated that due to staffing and COVID the department hasn't had an officer in the school for some time. Recently he met with the Superintendent and they decided an SRO was necessary. Chief Goldstein advised the committee that Officer Tracy would be assigned to the schools.

III. SALLY PORT UPGRADE

Chief Goldstein discussed with the committee the need for the impound lot to be moved to the police department.

IV. DISPATCH PROGRESS

Chief Goldstein advised the committee that the dispatch upgrade is moving along nicely and Communications Supervisor Kulacz is in constant contact with the vendors. Chair Chandler asked if it were possible to have regular updates on the status of the project at the City Council Meetings. Chief Goldstein agreed that this was a good idea and would make sure that it happens.

V. OTHER BUSINESS

Chief Goldstein explained to the committee that there is a need for body worn cameras. The committee discussed expense and options. Chief Goldstein advised the committee that the department was fully staffed. He emphasized that although this was the case the staffing level was at the same standards it was 30 + years ago.
